***6* NOTICES OF MOTION**

AWARE, that article 29 of the constitution of Kenya, 2010 grants every citizen a right to freedom and security.

FURTHER AWARE, that paragraph 5 of part 2 of the fourth schedule of the constitution 2010 provides for street lighting as a function of the county government.

NOTING that recent years have witnessed a marked increase in the number of insecurity incidences across the county and more so in Marsabit town, shauri yako, Majengo and Jirime area.

CONCERNED that most of the streets in the county are in darkness due to lack of proper lighting which has contributed to an increase in crime.

FURTHER concerned that most of the buildings, business premises, and public social amenities have no adequate lighting as per the standard practice.

ACKNOWLEDGING that paragraph 8 of part 2 of the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for a county planning and development including housing as a County function.

THEREFORE, this county assembly resolves that the CEC for Land, Energy and urban planning;

1. Initiate repair and maintenance of all existing but non-functional Street lights across the County CBDs
2. Formulate a policy to provide for installation of outdoor security lighting in all strategic points, streets and business premises to provide safer environment for the community.
3. Ensure all building plans for residential and commercial purposes have provision for installation of outdoor security lighting.

***7* STATEMENT**

Hon. Speaker, I wish to bring to the attention of this House a matter of great concern regarding the treatment of employees at the Vocational Training Centers in our County. A staff member has approached me with serious complaints regarding unfair labor practices;

Mr. Speaker, According to the employee, they were unfairly transferred and subsequently dismissed without due process. Furthermore, they were denied transport allowance despite being relocated. What is more concerning is that some of these directives were communicated through phone call, without any formal letters as established in Human Resource procedures.

Mr. Speaker, there is also an alleged theft of the Water tank and Solar panels that belong to Saku VTC.

Mr. Speaker, it is important that our County Institutions uphold the principles of fairness, transparency, and respect for employees' rights.

Hon. Speaker, pursuant to the standing order 41 (2) (c), through the Committee Chairperson I would like to request the Committee to investigate the allegations and provide a detailed report on the circumstances surrounding these actions.

Further, the CECM to elaborate the appropriate measures being put in place to avoid the recurrence of the mistreatment and violations of the employees' rights.

The CECM also investigate and provide the findings of the investigation on the theft of the said property of the institutions.
