***6* STATEMENT**

Hon. Speaker, in last year's budget (F/Y 2024/2025), this Honorable house allocated sum of 8 Million for football leagues to be played across the County.

Mr. Speaker, Football being a vital part of our youth lives and it's our responsibility to provide opportunities for them to engage in constructive activities. It has come to my attention that despite the allocation of these funds, the County did not organize a single football league to date.

Hon. Speaker, pursuant to the standing order 41 (2) (c) I want to request for a statement from Chairperson of the Committee on Education, Youths, Sports and Skills Development. In the Statement i want the Chairperson to respond to the following;

1. A detailed report on the status of football league across the County?
2. What caused the delay in the commencement of the Football league?
3. What is the fate of the allocation of 8 Million being made in the 2024/2025 budget?
4. What measures have you put in place to ensure that future leagues are organized and played without delay?

***7* STATEMENT**

Hon. Speaker, I rise to bring to the attention of this house a matter that is of great concern regarding the ambulance services in our County, which is a vital services to many, especially those in need of emergency medical care.

Mr. Speaker, as we are all aware, the "free ambulance services" are no longer free, and the people of this great County are being forced to bear the cost, which is the Fuel cost, allowance for the driver and the accompanying nurse.

Hon. Speaker, pursuant to the standing order 41 (2) (c) I want to request for a statement from Chairperson of the Committee on Health Services regarding the following;

1. What is the status of the free ambulance services in the County?
2. What measures are being put in place to ensure that most vulnerable populations have access to this essential services?

What is the operational status of the ambulance vehicles, particularly with lifesaving equipment that are operated by the department?

3. How many ambulance vehicles are offering services to the people of the Marsabit County?(provide response in the attached format)
4. What is the total number of ambulance vehicles (those which are in good condition and those which are not in operation) does the department have?

***9* MOTION: CONSIDERATION OF CASH FLOW PURSUANT TO SECTION 120 OF PFMA, 2012**

THAT, aware that the County Public Finance Laws (Amendment) Act, 2025 amended the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 to insert a new Section 109A establishing the County Assembly Fund to facilitate the financial autonomy of County Assemblies;

FURTHER AWARE that Section 109A(3) designates the Clerk of the County Assembly as the Administrator of the Fund;

NOTING that the National Treasury, through its Advisory dated 11th September, 2025 directed all County Assemblies to liaise with their respective County Executive Committee Members for Finance to operationalize the Fund and open the Fund Account at the Central Bank of Kenya;

ACKNOWLEDGING that, pursuant to this Advisory, the County Executive Committee Member for Finance has formally designated the Clerk of the County Assembly as the Administrator of the Marsabit County Assembly Fund, thereby initiating the process of operationalization of the Fund;

FURTHER NOTING, in accordance with Section 120 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, the County Treasury has approved the County Assembly Fund cash flow plan for FY 2025/2026, consistent with the Assembly-approved budget and the cash management framework under Section 120(1), thereby promoting predictable disbursements, fiscal discipline, and accountability in managing Assembly resources.

NOW THEREFORE, this House notes —

1. The designation of the Clerk of the County Assembly as the Administrator of the County Assembly Fund pursuant to Section 109A(3) of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012 (as amended); and
2. The approval by the County Executive Committee Member for Finance of the County Assembly Fund cash flow plan for FY 2025/2026, which aligns with the Assembly-approved budget and facilitates the full operationalization of the Marsabit County Assembly Fund.

***10* MOTION – RECONSTITUTION OF COMMITTEES**

THAT, pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order 156, and further to the Resolution of this House of 6th October, 2022, this House approves the appointment of Members to serve in the respective Committees of the County Assembly as specified in the Committee on Selection Report tabled on 6th November, 2025.

***11* MOTION**

AWARE, that article 29 of the constitution of Kenya, 2010 grants every citizen a right to freedom and security.

FURTHER AWARE, that paragraph 5 of part 2 of the fourth schedule of the constitution 2010 provides for street lighting as a function of the county government.

NOTING that recent years have witnessed a marked increase in the number of insecurity incidences across the county and more so in Marsabit town, shauri yako, Majengo and Jirime area.

CONCERNED that most of the streets in the county are in darkness due to lack of proper lighting which has contributed to an increase in crime.


FURTHER concerned that most of the buildings, business premises, and public social amenities have no adequate lighting as per the standard practice.

ACKNOWLEDGING that paragraph 8 of part 2 of the fourth schedule of the constitution of Kenya 2010 provides for a county planning and development including housing as a County function.

THEREFORE, this county assembly resolves that the CEC for Land, Energy and urban planning;

1. Initiate repair and maintenance of all existing but non-functional Street lights across the County CBDs
2. Formulate a policy to provide for installation of outdoor security lighting in all strategic points, streets and business premises to provide safer environment for the community.
3. Ensure all building plans for residential and commercial purposes have provision for installation of outdoor security lighting.
